Suggestions for the Public Forum Moderator

- 1. There will be two sign-in sheets (one for pro and con), and participants wishing to speak should sign up.
- 2. Moderator should be sure all attendees are aware of the ground rules for the forum, as well as all time limits.
- 3. Participants should be respectful of others. Any participant that shows disrespect to others will be asked to leave.
- 4. Moderator should alternate calling speakers from Pro and Con.
- 5. Be sure that someone is designated to answer questions raised by the community members or clarify facts presented (i.e., panel of experts, coalition chair, or event leader).
- 6. All questions should be directed to the moderator or the panel of experts if applicable. Participants should not address the crowd or other speakers directly. No debates among participants.
- 7. Participants should stick to a 2-3 minute time limit. A visible time clock will assist both the moderator and speakers to stay within the time limit.
- 8. Moderators should use their best judgment about the content of the messages. If the moderator feels a specific message has been repeated, he/she may request speakers to limit their comments to topics that have not yet been discussed.
- 9. Everyone interested in speaking should be given the opportunity to speak before anyone speaks a second time. If appropriate and time allows, the moderator can ask if anyone would like to speak again, keeping within the time limits.
